Zombies are at their most dangerous in the hours before rigor mortis sets in.

Father of the Zombie

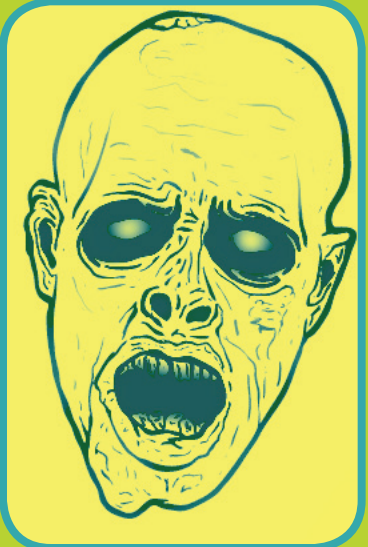
George A. Romero is widely viewed as the creator of the modern zombie cinema and the "Father of the Modern Zombie". He has written and directed more zombie films than anyone else.

Romero's first paid directing job was filming Mr. Rogers' tonsillectomy for Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood, an experience that Romero said somehow inspired him to pursue a career in horror films.

Romero's *The Night of the Living Dead* (1968) was the first zombie movie to show a physical cause of zombification. Previously zombies were created through Voodoo or other type of black magic. Through a copyright SNAFU, this movie is in the public domain.
